

LEGEND AND SUMMARY OF BEC WHITE EAST DAY TRAIL

WHITE EAST 16.5 miles  Clockwise loop with shorter 9 mile option

WHITE EAST: The trail starts downstream on River Road along the French Broad River. The trail climbs uphill from the reflecting Lagoon with views of the Biltmore House on the right. The trail passes near the carriage barn and the hack stable in the Deer Park area. At about 6.5 miles the trail climbs a single track to Lone Pine Mountain, the high point on the Estate, and then goes around the old water reservoir for the Estate. At just over 7 miles the trail comes to a pavilion area with a tie rack. You may tie your horse and take the very short walk to view the front of the Biltmore House from the statue of Diana, the Huntress (photo op). The trail then alternates between gravel road and dirt trail, coming down to the Bass Pond at about 8 miles from the start. (see ALTERNATE SHORTER ROUTE.) The trail continues through open areas created by Tropical Storm Helene and woods for another 7.5 miles and then comes back to the French Broad River and heads downstream on River Rd to the Day Trailer Parking.

ALTERNATE SHORTER ROUTE. At just over 8 miles at the Bass Pond, one can take the **GREEN East Trail (Black Arrows on Green Diamonds)** for $\frac{3}{4}$ mile back to the *Day Trailer Parking Area*. This shortens the ride to about 9 miles.

Trails marked with black arrows on white diamonds. Markers attached to trees or stakes.



At turns, expect one or more warning arrows before the turn. Turn arrow for White Trail.



There are confirming straight arrows after turns. Confirming arrow for White Trail.



There are occasional "go straight" arrows along the trail. Straight arrow for White Trail.



White octagons with **large black X mean wrong way** for White Trail. Do not pass.
